At one time the nerve centre of the Xirumi estate covering hundreds of hectares, today the castle is surrounded by one of the largest citrus groves in Sicily (200 hectares) and is still owned by the family.

The estate also includes a Late Stone Age necropolis, an area of great historical and archaeological interest.

Dating back to the 16th century, the building consists of an internal courtyard (300 m²) onto which open a granary and storerooms, and the "palmento" and "frantoio" (where grapes and olives are pressed).

The castle looks out onto a spacious garden of palms and Mediterranean flora and is available for use in summer. Finally, there is a charming consecrated church in the grounds. Inn the xirumi Castle will be held the Gala Dinner "Old Sicilian Gastronomical Itinerary" on April 11, 2003.


